Hullett Provincial Wildlife Area

The Hullett Provincial Wildlife Area is a 2100 hectare (5200 acre) multi-use property located in the Municipality of Central Huron about 5 km NE of Clinton, Ontario. The HPWA was designed to conserve natural habitat while providing wildlife-based recreational experiences for the public. The site was identified in the 1960s for its potential to be developed as a wetland, thereby creating significant wildlife habitat in southwestern Ontario. The site was converted in its present form during the late 1970s and early 1980s under a partnership agreement between the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and Ducks Unlimited Canada. Currently, the Friends of Hullett are responsible for most of the maintenance and operational management of the area. Hullett Provincial Wildlife Area is open for public use and enjoyment all year round at no charge. All forms of outdoor activities are encouraged.
